Subjective part of a global civil society: analysis approaches

Abstract. This article explores approaches to defining the entities that make up the global civil society. It is shown that the main subject is the international non-governmental organization, but increases the importance of other actors — collective and individual. Emphasized that global civil society is a complex system social structures, which are characterized by mix of members (institutions actors) and their voluntary associations and unions, social groups and nations. It includes a variety of volunteer associations, interest groups, non-profit and charitable associations, as well as less formal and stable forms of social organization, social network diaspora, social forums etc.

Emphasizes the importance of global civil society actors as academic institutions, business clubs and related network defenders of consumer rights, human rights activists, various initiatives to promote cooperation, environmental movements, ethnic groups, foundations, unions, groups of local people and organizations which provides help, peace movements, professional organizations, religious organizations, think tanks, network of women, youth associations, etc.

It is shown that subjects can be attributed «man Transnational», which connects their needs and interests not only with «their» state, but also with non-state social structures of transnational origin and with the world community as a whole.
